The night before you pet's surgery...

- ♥ Withhold all food and treats after 8:00 p.m.
- Water is acceptable for your pet until they come in for surgery.
- ♥ If you are currently administering any medications, vitamins and/or injections, withhold the morning doses unless otherwise instructed by the doctors.

Please arrive at your scheduled check-in time the morning of surgery. At this time, our team will be happy to answer any questions or concerns and collect the completed *Surgical & Anesthesia Consent Forms*. Please allow 10-15 minutes for the check-in of your pet.

If any questions arise, the doctor will contact you at the number on the *Surgical & Anesthesia Consent Form*.

Feel free to call & check up on your pet's status. You will be contacted after the procedure(s) has been completed. Pets can go home the day following surgery at your scheduled check-out time. When you arrive to take your pet home, our team will go over all discharge orders and give you a written copy of the instructions. We welcome any questions you might have about your pets care after surgery.

We hope your pets surgery day will be a pleasant experience. Remember, our team knows surgery can be an anxious time and we are always available to answer all questions concerning the upcoming procedure.

We look forward to serving you and your pet on the upcoming surgery day and in the years to come.

## PRE-ANESTHETIC BLOOD TESTING INFORMATION FORM

(PLEASE READ CAREFULLY)

Our greatest concern is the well-being of your pet; therefore, a full physical examination will be performed before putting your pet under anesthesia. However, there are certain conditions that are not detected without pre-anesthetic blood work. Test results will provide evidence of pre-existing conditions, establish baseline data & offer you peace of mind. A **Pre-Anesthetic Blood Profile** is required for animals over 5 years of age but strongly recommended for all pets undergoing anesthesia to maximize patient safety.

The Pre-Anesthetic Blood Profile helps alert our surgeon to the presence of dehydration, anemia, infection, diabetes, kidney and/or liver disease, which could complicate the procedure. These conditions may not be detected without a pre-anesthetic blood profile. These tests are similar to those your own physician would run if you were to undergo anesthesia. In addition, these tests may be useful in the future if your pet's health changes, allowing, more accurate diagnoses and treatments. This test can be done at our clinic on the morning of surgery.

The Surgical and Anesthesia Consent Form offers pre-anesthetic blood work. This includes:

- CBC: PCV (Anemia), White Blood Cell Count (Infection) & Red Blood Cell Count (Anemia/Bleeding Disorder), Platelet Count (Clotting Disorder)
- Profile: BUN and Creatinine (Kidney), ALP and ALT (Liver), Glucose (Sugar), Total Protein (Dehydration), and Electrolytes (Imbalances).

For feline patients, the triple test is recommended which tests for Feline Leukemia, Feline Infectious Viremia and Heartworm. We highly recommend this test be performed on all feline patients at least once in their lives because these diseases can affect your cats longevity & ability to recover from surgery. If your cat goes outside, we recommend administering the Feline Leukemia vaccine as well. Please ask us if you would like to learn more about Feline Leukemia, Feline Infectious Viremia and/or Heartworm.

We realize surgery and anesthesia are scary for both the owner and the patient and we attempt to make surgery day as safe and comfortable for all involved. The physical examination and blood work done prior to any surgical procedure allows us to best minimize anesthetic and surgical risks and maximize patient safety.

# Laser Surgery Consent Form

As part of our commitment to quality care, we are pleased to offer laser surgery as a safe and comfortable treatment for your pet. We feel laser surgery provides the best possible care for your pet.

#### Benefits of laser surgery are:

Less Pain- nerve endings are sealed as the laser cuts so there will be reduced pain for your pet following surgery. Less Bleeding-, small blood vessels are cauterized with the laser during surgery, greatly reducing blood loss. Less Swelling- the laser energy does not crush, tear, or bruise the tissue because there is no physical contact. Reduced Risk of Infection-The high heat of the laser energy kills bacteria and micro-organisms as it moves through tissue.

Quicker Recovery-Your pet is likely to feel less discomfort after surgery, and return to normal activities sooner.

The surgery will be performed with carbon dioxide laser, which produces an invisible beam of light that can remove a precise layer of tissue at one time, which replaces the traditional scalpel. The laser energy instantly vaporizes the water found in tissues allowing it to cut, which causes no trauma to surrounding tissue. We can use laser surgery for declaws, spays, neuters (canine), tumor removal, skin tags, cyst removal, and other procedures normally done with a scalpel.

I understand the laser surgery is an option and I have been advised of the advantages the procedure will offer.
